Indigenous Scholarship Program

The Seton Catholic College Board provides Indigenous Scholarships for the following purpose:

- To provide Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students with an opportunity to interact positively within a Catholic School environment.
- To enable equity of access to educational services provided by Seton Catholic College.
- To increase the intake of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students at Seton Catholic College.
- To achieve equitable and quality educational outcomes for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students.

Eligibility Criteria

- Applicants must be of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander descent.
- Consideration may be given to the financial status of the applicant and their family.
- The student has a strong desire for a Catholic education.
- The successful applicant must live within the catchment area which is bound by the Swan River, Leeming and Kwinana suburbs.
- The applicant should be willing to become involved in the College Co-curricular activities in accordance with the ethos of Seton Catholic College.
- Year 7 is the preferred point of entry, but consideration may be given to entry into other years.

Value of the Scholarship

The minimum value of each scholarship covers the cost of tuition fees.

At the discretion of the selection panel, an additional amount may be made available for compulsory charges such as subject levies, camp fees and excursions.

- Uniforms and textbooks are the responsibility of the Parent/Guardian(s). Uniforms can be purchased new at the Uniform shop on campus, or second-hand through a Facebook group run by College parents.
- Textbooks can only be purchased at Woolridges Educational Supplies.

Application Fee

No application fee applies to the Indigenous Scholarship Application.

Review Process

Scholarships can be awarded for a period of up to 6 years (Year 7 to Year 12 inclusive) and will be reviewed at the end of each term. The continuation of a scholarship from year to year will be subject to:

- Academic progress
- Attendance
- Behaviour
- Compliance with Seton Catholic College enrolment contract
- Commitment to programs that are initiated by the Indigenous Student Coordinator for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students.

In circumstances of continued inappropriate behaviour or lack of effort in students the scholarship may be withdrawn, in such a case Parent/Guardian(s) will receive clear cautions and feedback by telephone, meetings and correspondence.

Indigenous Student Coordinator

The Indigenous Student Coordinator is a full member of staff and in the capacity shares with teachers responsibility related to the promotion of Seton's classroom management, teaching and learning process and pastoral care. Support is also given to students in the areas of academic achievement, participation, attendance and discipline to improve the educational outcomes for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students.

The Indigenous Student Coordinator also plays a key role in providing knowledge and understanding of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander history, language and culture within the College and establishing strong links among the family and College staff.

Student Support

A student may require academic assistance, such as one-on-one tutoring. A program will be put in place suitable to the needs of the student following discussions between teachers, parents, Indigenous Student Coordinator and the Educational Support Unit on Campus.

Enrolment Process

When an application is lodged, an interview will take place with the Deputy Principal of Wellbeing and the Indigenous Student Coordinator.

If successful, parent and/or guardian(s) will be notified and a meeting will take place with the Indigenous Student Coordinator to discuss the expectations of Seton Catholic College and Scholarship requirements. This will also be an opportunity to discuss any other matters.

The Indigenous Student Coordinator will be available between school hours to provide advice and support upon request.

Application Forms

In addition to the standard Seton Catholic College Enrolment Application Form and required documents, scholarship applicants need to complete the Indigenous Scholarship Form.
